

Rising Star Quilt Guild Mystery Quilt 2020 - 21

Clue #2

This month we are keeping it simple since you will all probably be busy with the holidays. We are making sets of 4 Flying Geese for each Block 1.

Organizational Note: Since you will be working on both blocks simultaneously, it may be helpful to keep all of the pieces of each block in separate bags or boxes.

I use the no waste method, which I describe, step by step below. Here are some links to more detailed directions that include visuals.

Feel free to use whatever method you prefer in making sets of 4 flying geese to get the correct size: **Finished size – 2 ½” X 4 ½”** (which includes the ¼” seam).

For the small quilt you will need **5 sets of 4 = 20** Rec: 8 sets of 4 = 32; LG: 13 sets of 4 = 52

For each **set of 4** cut:

4 – 2 7/8” squares of Fabric A

1 - 5 ¼” square of Fabric B

Step 1.) Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the 4 small squares

Step 2): Place 2 small squares on opposite corners of the large square so the lines make one long diagonal, corner to corner. The small squares will overlap in the center.

Step 3): Stitch ¼ “ seam on either side of the line. Cut apart on line, press open.

Step 4): Place remaining small squares on the one empty corner of each piece. Stitch ¼ “ seam on either side of the line, cut and press open. You will have 4 flying geese.

You should now have some of Block 1 and some of Block 2.
